FULTON COUNTY COUNCIL MEETING Tuesday, April 17, 2018

Meeting called to order following Pledge to the Flag at 6:30 p.m. with Randy Sutton, Barry Hazel, Ron Dittman, Lorie Hurst, Jim Showley, Jim Widman and Auditor Christina Sriver present.

CORONER – Jeri Good stated that of the 50 deaths so far this year 9 have been Coroner calls. She recommends with the families of the deceased if there are genetic issues in march she met with the Fulton County Leadership Academy and the Youth Leadership Academy. She was at Ancilla for a Symposium recently for a forensic. She met with buckeye Pipeline and Festival preparedness. Last week she attended a Narcan training session Jeri Good stated that of the 50 deaths so far this year 9 have been Coroner calls. There have been 3 autopsies so far this year. Two have required toxicology and labs. She met with the Fulton County Leadership Academy and the Youth Leadership Academy to talk about the office duties. She was at Ancilla College recently to a symposium about forensics comparing the medical examiners system and the coroner's system. She has been trained on the use of Narcan in Marshall County last week. She stated the public can now be authorized to use Narcan. The Prom crashes will be coming up in conjunction with the other emergency services. There is a Spillman training next week that she will be attending. Mass fatalities training next week. She thanked all other emergency service providers that she works with. She would like to pursue the Narcan provider services but she must pursue the right channels first.

IT DEPARTMENT – Josh Sriver discussed the concrete and limestone work needing to be done at the courthouse. The steps are currently sitting on the steps rather than on their own foundation. The west sides of the building steps are separating from the foundation as well as the south side. The best way to approach is with an architectural firm. Casi Cowles in planning helped narrow down the recommendation of SRKM. They have quoted in three phases. The steps should be reinforced due to being above the basement. He would like to work on tis from May to October. Having an architect would cover the liability portion. It will take six figures to complete the concrete and limestone work. The lions are part of the project. Lori motioned to accept, Randy seconded; passed 6-0. Ziolkowski Construction quoted to clean the limestone around the courthouse for \$40,321. The cleaning will commence prior to the concrete work. The shrubs have been cleared by the highway department in preparation. They will mark any spots of concern. Some spots have been done recently. Randy motioned to approve the cleaning of the limestone, Barry seconded; passed 6-0. The time clock system is going smoothly. The ticketing system is underway. Comcast still has to move the lines for the server project. Child support will be down temporarily for the move. He would like to make his part-time assistant full-time as was approved in the budget starting next month; Council approved pending a job description.

COMMUNICATIONS – Barry updated that the City has agreed to pay \$50,000 towards the midnight dispatch. The city will not be going with Spillman and the county contract will be adjusted accordingly.

HIGHWAY – John Geier updated on the department activities including sign inventory, culvert replacements (so far 5 complete and one more large and small ones yet to complete), a road program for chip and seal, grading gravel and patching holes. Commissioners agree to prepay for chip and seal oil to 264,000 at \$1.58/gal. That will secure for 50-60 miles of chip and seal (60%). Central Paving will begin making pug mix; they pulled in today. For flooding damage, \$234,000 of damage will be turned in to FEMA. Old 31 and Camp Shohola bridges have been turned in for Federal Grants. Bridge #45 will have a pre-con meeting; he would like to start construction mid-August with completion by the end of October.

Tow paving projects for Community Crossings will be started by Phend and Brown by the end of May. He would like to purchase a tractor with highway funds rather than cum cap, he had submitted an additional request for this. Randy commented that the Safety committee discussed the possibility of closing the courthouse for the concrete repairs/rebuilds. Josh discussed that SRKM will propose solutions at the time of construction.

SHERIFF - Chris Sailors reviewed the March reports. As of this morning there were 123 in-jail population with 31 out-of-county. H reminded Council of the tech grant was granted through the phone company but the system didn't work correctly. The company (CPC) will allow \$180,000 toward fixing the issues and he will be using Secured Automated Systems for the corrections; they will be on site Thursday. The data retention will be held at the Annex building. He has been on a tour at the jail with the City officials recently he has also been asked to speak on the jail issues coming up and he has prepared a presentation which he will forward to Council and Commissioners. He plans to have town hall meetings also to update the public on overcrowding issues. He will be offering a citizen shooter class on April 28th and May 12th both are already full. He would like to continue to offer the class through the summer and fall months. He has a conference call with Umbaugh and Ice Miller tomorrow and would like to have a meeting following to follow-up. On May 11th he will be visiting the Adams County Jail and offers any of the jail committee and Council to attend. He has also been offered tour the Miami County jail. He attended a meeting with the Rochester Community School board to discuss active shooter training and then Caston schools on the same topic. He will be at the Caston school board meeting to discuss the active shooter training. He has had several churches request training also. The IT department will be preparing the MDT units in anticipation of the Spillman kick-off in May. With the next ten days he should be picking up the new pick-up trucks. He has had a full-time jailer that is leaving and will move a part-timer into the position. Also he was notified today that a transporter is leaving. A deputy is also leaving. A couple jail windows are needing replaced and he is working on that currently. There will be an additional presented tonight for housing. Randy and Jim Showley voiced that they would like to view the Miami County jail.

JOB CLASSIFICATION COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION – Lorie stated that they reviewed the Clerk's position at the highway department, upon review they recommend that the position be changed to a COMOT III with a pay change the nest pay period. Jim Showley motioned to approve, Ron seconded; passed 6-0. They also have a recommendation for 2 CDL-required part-time positions and 1 part-time position with no CDL requirement. Jim Showley motioned to approve, Jim Widman seconded; passed 6-0.

MINUTES – The minutes from the March 20th meeting were motioned for approval by Randy, Barry second; passed 6-0.

KEWANNA PUBLIC LIBRARY – Charlie Rude discussed the additional appropriation request for the library steps from the Rainy day fund. They plan to use DLG Construction from Akron for the work. Randy motioned to approve, Jim Showley seconded; passed 6-0.
